**ORDER FOR SUSPENSION
OF CPA CERTIFICATE
CPA Certificate No. #18214**

Board File No. 2012-342

1. The Minnesota Board of Accountancy ("Board") is authorized pursuant to Minnesota Statutes sections 326A.01-326A.14 (2012) to license, regulate, and discipline persons who apply for, or hold a certificate as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) in the State of Minnesota and is further authorized pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 326A.08 and Minnesota Statutes section 214.10 (2012) to initiate appropriate disciplinary action.

2. Fred Allan Ehlert ("Respondent") has been and is now subject to the jurisdiction of the Board from which he holds a certificate as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA).

3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 270C.72, subdivision 1 (2012), the Board must suspend a CPA certificate if the certificate holder owes delinquent state taxes, penalties, or interest, and the Minnesota Commissioner of Revenue so notifies the Board.

4. On August 16, 2012, the Board received a letter of License Revocation/Suspension from the Minnesota Department of Revenue, which advised the Board that Respondent has an overdue tax liability. Under Minnesota Statutes section 270C.72 (2012), the Board must suspend Respondent's certificate as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA).

ORDER


1. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent's CPA Certificate No. 18214 shall be SUSPENDED pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 270C.72, subdivision 1 (2012). During the period of suspension Respondent shall not offer to perform or perform any services in this State that require certification as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA), including holding himself out to the public as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA).

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that during the period of suspension, Respondent shall remove the designation of being a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) from all Respondent's advertisements, business cards, business forms, and signage.

3. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the suspension shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until the Board receives a Tax Clearance Certificate from the Minnesota Department of Revenue indicating that Respondent does not owe the State any uncontested delinquent taxes, penalties, or interest and has filed all required returns. If a Tax Clearance Certificate is received, the Board shall then issue an Order to rescind this suspension of Respondent's CPA certificate.
